Assessment - Santa Rosa Junior College

Can I take credit classes at SRJC without having my GED or HiSET first? Yes, in general the only requirement for taking classes at SRJC is that you must be 18 years or older before the first day of the semester and no longer enrolled in high school—you do not need to have your GED first.

How to Study for English Placement Tests | The Classroom

Students generally take approximately 80 minutes to complete the entire English Placement test, spending an average of 30 seconds on each exam item. Reading Comprehension Test The focus of the Reading Comprehension Test is on vocabulary, style and the meaning of each sentence.

Credit ESL Placement Test: The English as a Second Language (ESL) placement test is for non-native English speakers, testing their skills in English reading and grammar. Students will receive 45 minutes to answer 75 multiple choice questions.
